CEMEREM promotes sustainable mining, resource management, and environmental engineering in Kenya through innovative academic programmes, applied research, and international knowledge exchange.



GOALS

Kenya's "Vision 2030" sets out ambitious development goals aimed at enhancing prosperity and quality of life. The resource sector is expected to contribute significantly to these aims. However, despite Kenya's significant natural resources, there is often a shortage of skilled professionals and sustainable management strategies. Additionally, ecological challenges persist. CEMEREM addresses these gaps by strengthening practice-oriented education, applied research, and capacity development in mining, processing, environmental engineering, and resource management – though the education of new generations of professionals and the training of practitioners. Close collaboration between Kenyan and German universities fosters innovative and sustainable solutions for the sector.

KEY ACTIONS

CEMEREM empowers African students with the expertise needed for the responsible use of natural resources. Its core activities include the development and refinement of interdisciplinary study programmes at all levels (BSc, MSc, MBA, and PhD), the provision of training for academic staff and professionals, and active engagement with government, industry, and local communities. International conferences, research visits, and summer schools further promote collaborative, application-driven research.
