# **Sustainable Operations for Resource Management** and Food Supply (SCO)





SCO promotes sustainable management along the entire supply chain – through interdisciplinary master's programmes, international exchange, and practiceoriented training for responsible resource use.



## **GOALS**

Considering global challenges at the intersection of resource conservation, food security, and sustainable development, SCO aims to systematically integrate sustainability into higher education curricula across key academic disciplines - including economics, agricultural sciences, and engineering. Central to this initiative is the training of urgently needed professionals, future leaders and leaders capable of implementing sustainable management processes throughout the entire supply chain – particularly in areas relating to food and other health-relevant resources. Graduates are prepared to **assume key roles** in industry, research, and the public sector.

# **KEY ACTIONS**

At the core of the project are two interdisciplinary master's programmes: Business Research (MBR) and Sustainable Management and Operations (SuMO). Both programmes offer academically rigorous training in sustainable resource management, alongside the planning, coordination, and optimisation of production and service processes. They are designed for professionals and students from a variety of backgrounds. In parallel, academic staff receive targeted training to help embed sustainability more deeply into higher education curricula. All study and training programmes offered by the centre are closely aligned with the development strategies of the partner countries and the specific needs of policy, business, and society.
